Cost Effective Building Retrofits Through Air Leakage Control

Learn how air leakage, uncontrolled, through the building envelope, can lead to condensation, moisture damage in hidden cavities, rain penetration, poor indoor temperature and humidity control, and unnecessary heat loss in winter or heat gain in summer. For the building to operate efficiently it must be built tight and ventilated right – very difficult to achieve if the building is full of holes. The various parts of the building envelope will be discussed in turn, in the order of their significance related to the efficient operation of the building, with slides to show typical oversights on the part of both designers and engineers which are continually observed.
